



## Wanda Pickett Sweatman

Wanda Jean Pickett Sweatman, 65, of Roebuck, SC, died Sunday, June 14, 2020, at Spartanburg Medical Center. Born May 10, 1955, in Ft. Campbell, KY where her father was enlisted in the Army, she was the daughter of Geneva Fennel Pickett of Florence, SC and the late John Wesley Pickett.
